

Crescent Pointe GC Handicapping Policies and Procedures

As of : January 2021

The Handicap Committee within our golf club is responsible for all aspects of the USGA Handicap System including the computation of each member's Handicap Index. As a Committee, we will verify that all acceptable scores are reported for handicap purposes. All recorded scores will be made readily available for peer review.

Handicap Committee Members: Cody Jennings, Greg Kingery, Gail Brown, Tom Caffrey. Brian Johnson, club professional, serves as our advisor.

The Handicap Committee has set forth the following policies and procedures for all members using the USGA Handicap System:

Each player will try to make the best score at every hole in every round, regardless of where the round is played

Post all acceptable rounds for peer review, including nine hole scores

Scores must be posted within 48 hours of the round being played

Maximum score on each hole is NET double bogey (par+2+ any strokes received due to handicap)

All acceptable scores must be posted using one of the following methods

Posting computer in the Pro Shop at the golf course

Posting via internet to the [HTTP//GHIN.COM](http://GHIN.COM) website

Ask our Pro Shop personnel to post your score

Any organized outing with group competition and prizes can be designated as a Competition and will be designated as a 'C' in the system. Unlike the Tournament Postings of the past, Competitions carry no additional weight and only exist in your recent 20 Postings until they roll off. C-scores may be referenced by the Committee should an adjustment be considered prior to any competition.

Failure to post a score, or a player manipulating the handicap index will be subject to penalties. The first time the player will receive a warning. The second time, the player will not be allowed to play in organized games or tournaments for a one week period. The Handicap Committee has the ultimate authority and obligation to adjust a member's Handicap Index if it feels necessary to do so. A posting of the lowest score of your last 20 Postings will be entered by the committee into GHIN for recalcitrant offenders.

TERMS DEFINED:

Acceptable Scores (USGA Q & As)

When at least seven holes are played (7-12 holes are posted as a 9-hole score; 13 or more are posted as an 18-hole score)

Scores on all courses with a valid Course Rating™ and Slope Rating®

Scores in all forms of competition: match play, stroke play, and team competitions where each player play their own ball

Scores made under The Rules of Golf

Scores played under the local rule of "preferred lies"
